Estate Presentation: The vineyard of this chateau is famous for having belonged to Jeanne de Lestonac, the niece of the famous 16th century French author, Michel de Montaigne. The Dubreys have been winegrowers since the 17th century and have succeeded in developing and establishing the reputation of their wine.

Tasting Notes : The color of this wine is nice and dark, clear and brilliant. Its bouquet expresses intense aromas of red fruit as well as violets. The tannins are mellow, the finish long and smooth.
