Presentation

Located at the far northern tip of the Médoc peninsula near the Gironde Estuary, the vines of Château Plagnac stretch out around a white-stone manor house. Its two towers look down onto 40 hectares of vines in a single stretch on soils renowned for producing top wines. The vines here have now reached full maturity, producing an expressive wine combining finesse and complexity.

Location : Bégadan

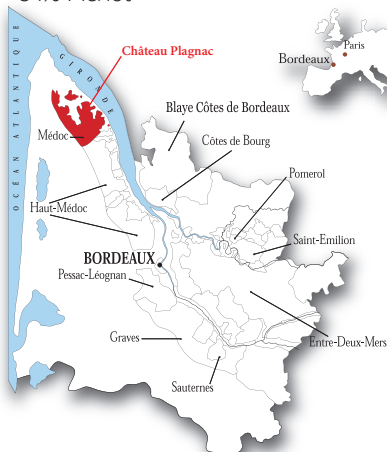
Soil : Gravels

66% Cabernet Sauvignon

34% Merlot



Tasting note

Deep red intense color, alleging a beautiful structure. On the nose, notes of red ripe berries blend with a final oaky touch with great distinction. On the palate, a nice overall harmony with soft and generous tannins, an attractive volume and a long finish of good quality. A bottle in which the balance between Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon is expressed in complete serenity.
