Presentation

Château Richebon stems from the 5th classified growth Chateau Croizet-Bages founded by the Croizet brothers in the 18th century. It had been run by an American for a while before it was bought by its current owner, the Quié family, in 1942.

Its vineyard of Garonnaise gravels, partly crossed by halieutic sandbanks lets the main varieties of the Chateau Richebon Cabernet-Sauvignon and Merlot express themselves to their height. As the Heirs of Paul Quié, Jean-Philippe and his sister Anne-Françoise are carefully respecting traditional techniques of the family by carrying out a twenty one day soft maceration period so as to extract the most elegant fruity notes from the grapes which is so particular to the Pauillac Appellation.

Tasting note

Boasting a lovely ruby-red colour with purple tints, this wine releases scents of red berries, cassis and blueberry, along with a hint of fresh vanilla. On the palate the attack is fleshy and intense, with velvety tannins. Flavours of ripe cherry emerge, mingling with notes of mild spices and paprika. Lightly woody notes come out, although respecting the fruity character of the wine. The finish is long and flavoursome.
