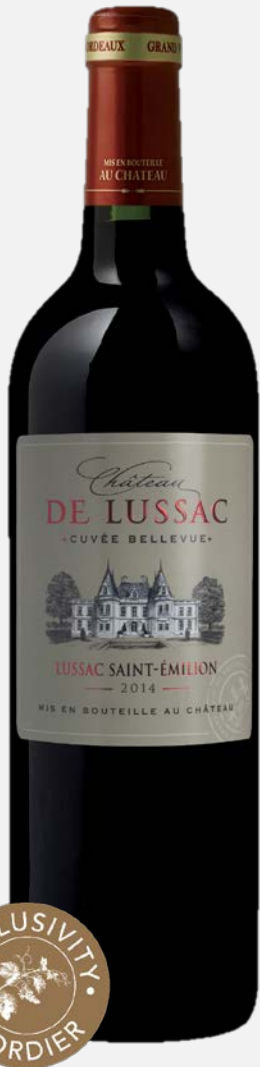


Château de Lussac

Vintage : 2014

Varietals: 51% Merlot, 48% Cabernet Franc & 1% Petit Verdot

Vineyard area: 33 ha.

Average age of vines: 30 years

Estate Presentation: Located in the heart of the village, the Chateau de Lussac is easily visible by its architecture. The building was built in 1876 by Gascon Montouroy. Renovated in 2000 by Griet and Hervé Laviale (current owners), the Chateau de Lussac has undergone extensive renovation work. A superb circular tank has been created.

Tasting Notes : Chateau de Lussac “Cuvée Bellevue” is an elegant wine with a brilliant ruby red color. The nose offers aromas of vanilla and spices, with a hint of discreet and mellow woodiness on the palate. The impact is frank, with well-rounded tannins. The finish is long and structured with good persistent aromas.
