Located in the heart of the village, Château de Lussac is clearly visible due to its distinctive architecture. The building was constructed in 1876 by Gascon Montouroy. The property was then transferred to his brother-in-law, the Marquis de Sercey until 1980. Olivier Roussel then managed the estate for 15 years.

Taken over in 2000 by Griet and Hervé Laviale, Chateau de Lussac has undergone important renovation work. A superb circular fermenting room has been created.

Tasting note

Château de Lussac «Cuvée Bellevue» is an elegant wine with a brilliant ruby red colour. The nose offers aromas of vanilla and spices, with a hint of discreet and mellow woodiness on the palate. The impact is frank, with well-rounded tannins. The finish is long and structured with good persistent aromas. It will complement white meat and wild mushrooms such as grilled veal chops with chanterelles mushrooms or free-range chicken stuffed with herbs.
